My response to the GMRP response as to the claims against the remediation project and boat owners expected and unforeseen expenses arising from the disruption to usage and availability of our property for storage and lift in, lift out exercises due to the scope of work provided by the GMRP team.

My claim for compensation is based on accurate estimates of expenses required if my vessel was to be moved from its traditional and accepted seasonal storage area. I will pursue this claim should that movement of my boat become fact.

HOWEVER:

I understand that the GMRP have amended the schedule and arranged certain stages of demolition and re-construction so as not to require the re-location, off site storage of my and others members vessels.

The proposal to lift out and store our vessels on-at the Giant Mine Civic boat Launch for one winter and then launch these boats the next spring returning them in that fall at close of boating season to our accustomed and traditional (and promised as improved) Baker Creek area property is acceptable and appreciated and would make any financial claims on my part CEASE thereby becoming un-necessary.

I strongly believe that this remediation/cleanup project is needed and required and necessary to fix the un-acceptable abandoned and poisonous Giant Mine Site.

I believe for all of us, future generations, and the future of the Yellowknife area, Great Slave Lake and the Mackenzie water shed.

I commend the GMRP for this revised plan benefitting all residents with improved future recreational boating facilities. Requiring little or no expense or disruption to the people of Yellowknife, private recreational water users and affiliated club members, The Great Slave Sailing Club, Sailing School, Paddling Club, Great Slave Yacht Club and Mining Heritage Society.

I look forward to observing the project as it progresses and to relaxing,(breathing a sigh of relief) when it is completed. I appreciate the benefits that will accrue to all for fixing this situation properly, finally.
