Hi all,

Thanks for looping me in, Wendy.

I don't think this work could be considered a Modification under the Licence, as it's not related to a physical structure and isn't being engineered. Part D, Condition 20 requires the Hamlet to maintain the SWDF so the satisfaction of an Inspector, so if Wendy is fine with these changes, then that's great.

The only thing I'd draw your attention to, Susan, is that if there are operational changes that result from this work, please make sure they're reflected in the next revision of the SWDF Operation and Maintenance Plan. And, as Wendy mentioned, it would be a good idea to detail the work done in the next Annual Water Licence Report (which is due at the end of June).

Hi Susan,

Thanks for getting in contact with me prior to starting work. I don't see any issues with the plans below. I do have a few questions and comments below though:

- ENR assumes the cleared trees will be used for firewood. If brush piles are created and the Hamlet intends to burn these when it is safe to do so, a burn Permit will be required. This can be issued by ENR in Fort Providence. **Please note that a fire ban is in effect at the moment due to extremely dry conditions.**
- If there is any staining, or spills in the End of Life (EOL) vehicle area (due to leaking fluids in vehicles), please clean up this material before applying the fill. We can discuss disposal options for any contaminated soil when I'm there in June. The contractor should be careful when stacking up vehicles as I doubt these vehicles have had all hazardous fluids and wastes removed. Ideally this should be done before these vehicles are accepted at the facility. Overall, we want to avoid any hazardous wastes in the EOL vehicles being released to the

receiving environment. If a spill occurs as a result of movement/or stacking, please let me know.

- Please indicate the area where the cables and steel to be buried more clearly. Is it indicated by the scribbled area on the sketch towards the north end of the landfill? If so, that should be fine. I think that waste is located in that area already. Burying this material will take up space and reduce the capacity/lifespan of the landfill. The Hamlet could try getting a recycler to come and take the scrap metal, but that is the Hamlet's decision. Approximately how much material is to be buried? This activity should be reported in the Annual water licence Report.

I have cc'd Erica Janes here to keep the Board apprised of the Hamlet's plans. If the Board requires notification for your proposed plans (as per modifications to the landfill), I will let you know.

Hi Wendy,

We are looking at getting a contractor (Cherdon) to do some clean up at the landfill. Council also is wanting some clearance around the perimeter of the fence for safety reasons (so you can see bears).

Here is what we are looking to do and I just wanted to run it by you for your comments/approval:

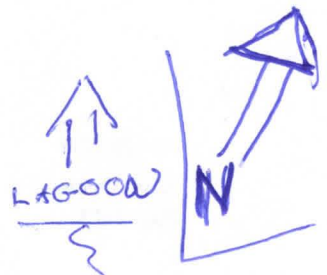
- Clear roughly 40' of treed area around the chain link fence. This was discussed at Council and they directed we proceed.
- Use the soil or material from this clearing of trees to pack down a foundation base for the corner where old vehicles are stored.
- Have the contractor stack the old vehicles and it is messy right now.
- **The contractor is proposing to “bury” some old cables and steel that has been sitting there for years and years. It is all coiled and messy. Is it okay to do that?**

I've attached a rough sketch from Clifford. The “xxxxx” area shows the trees around the fence. (this is somewhat outside regular landfill clean up I suppose). The circled area close to the center shows where the contractor would like to bury the cable.

Work will not go ahead until we have heard back from your office.
