Re.: Extension Request of Redbed Resources Corp Land Use Permit MV2019C0029

Dear Mr. Mullaney,

I am writing on behalf of Redbed Resources Corp. and Director James Coyne.

Redbed Resources wishes to apply for a 2-year extension to its Type-A Mineral Exploration Permit #MV2019C0029, and continue mineral exploration, including exploration drilling, on its mineral claims and leases in your area.

Redbed Resources was negatively affected by Covid19-related travel restrictions in 2020 and 2021, and unable to benefit from the full 5 years of activities permitted under #MV2019C0029.

As part of our requested extension, the following activities, materials and equipment, approved under MV2019C0029, would be used over the 2025 and 2026 field seasons:

- Continued use, maintenance and expansion of the Coates Lake Camp, a fully solar-powered 10 to 12-man facility without reliance on diesel power generation for day-to-day operation
- Continued use of man portable RC or diamond drill(s) to expand on the near 3000m of drilling completed over the past 3 years
- Continued use of UTVs and low impact track mounted vehicles for summer transportation and drill moves
- Small excavator may be mobilized for loading heavy drill parts onto tracked vehicle for transportation and for reclamation efforts upon program completion
- The expected seasonal consumption of 100 x 205 litre drums of diesel/jetA, 5 x 205 litre drum of gasoline, 19 x 205 litre drums of avgas, and 10 x 40lb tanks of propane to operate equipment, with continued return of empty barrels for recycling, throughout the season

Redbed Resources conceives maintaining field operations from approximately break up to freeze up, over a period of 3 to 5 months annually. The 2025 exploration plan would be elaborated this winter and include type of activities, location, depth and number of drill holes, and overall level of exploration effort.

Redbed Resources Corp is a family run business. Alongside H. Coyne & Sons Ltd and Kluane Drilling Ltd, the Company operates a driller helper training program, in Whitehorse, each spring. First Nation members local to the Redbed Project are invited to attend this training. Successful completion of the training program can lead to seasonal employment for driller helpers through Kluane Drilling Ltd., and more specifically on the Redbed Resources exploration program.

Earlier this January, Jim Coyne and I prepared a list of local stakeholders, coordinated communication, and organized a trip to the region to meet, in person, with community members.

We have now travelled from Whitehorse and are visiting the communities of Fort Liard, Nahanni Butte, Fort Simpson, Wrigley, Tulita, and Norman Wells during the first week of February. We have attached a list of stakeholders and a tentative schedule for travel.
