Basecamp:

Inspectors from the Department of Environment and Climate Change conducted an inspection of Land Use Permit MV2015J0001 on September 3, 2024. The Land Use Permit is held by South Nahanni Outfitters for the purpose of the operation and maintenance of camp facilities, operation, and maintenance of the airstrip and storage of fuel.

There was a total of 18 improvements on the site at the time of inspection. Improvements consisted of cabins, tool sheds, a skinning shed, generator shack, walk in cooler, kitchen, shower, and two outhouses. All structures were made of wood with a tin roof. Improvements were in good condition.

A water pump ran from the root river uphill to the camp to supply water. The camp is primarily powered by solar, with a diesel generator as backup.
