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1 PROJECT INTRODUCTION

Westcoast Energy Inc., (Westcoast) is proposing to take the Pointed Mountain gas transmission pipeline permanently out of service (the Project). The pipeline is currently deactivated and is no longer in operation.

The Pointed Mountain pipeline segment is approximately 56 kilometres (km) of 20-inch pipeline. The pipeline starts in the Northwest Territories (NWT) near Pointed Mountain, passes through the Yukon Territory (YT) and ends in British Columbia. As part of the Project, Westcoast plans to remove exposed segments of pipeline and remove above ground equipment.

To accommodate the proposed scope of work and the workforce, Westcoast will require a temporary work camp in the area to provide lodging for up to 70 people.

In order to conduct this work, Westcoast will be applying to the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board (MVLWB) for a Type-A Land Use Permit and a Type-A Water License. Westcoast has also filed an application with the Canada Energy Regulator (CER) pursuant to Section 241 of the Canada Energy Regulator Act (the Act) for leave to abandon. This document outlines the consultation and engagement plans with potentially affected parties in the region to undertake the Project.

2 OBJECTIVES AND PROJECT SCOPE

2.1 Objectives

The objectives for undertaking consultation for the Project as outlined within this Engagement Plan (Plan) include the following:

- Ensure the procedural aspects of the duty to consult with Indigenous groups that are delegated to Westcoast are met and all regulatory requirements for consultation and engagement have been achieved.
- Build and maintain positive long-term relationships with communities and Indigenous groups.
- Ensure consultation and engagement activities for the Project are coordinated and aligned with other regional CIE activities.
- Contribute and align with the Regional Engagement Plan and Enbridge's Indigenous Engagement Policy <https://www.enbridge.com/about-us/our-values/indigenous-communities/indigenous-peoples-policy>
- Contribute and align with Enbridge's 2022 Indigenous Reconciliation Action Plan.

These objectives will be achieved by undertaking the following steps:



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- Identify Indigenous groups with interests in the Project area and other potentially affected parties such as landowners and other rights holders, who could potentially be affected by the Project as soon as possible in the planning phase.
- Inform identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties throughout the various phases of the Project by sharing information on key Project specifics in a clear and timely manner.
- Create opportunities for meaningful engagement as early as possible in the planning process and advise Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties of their opportunities to communicate with the regulator.
- Understand and respond to any issues or concerns in an effort to resolve or mitigate those issues or concerns.
- Ensure economic participation is provided to Indigenous owned businesses and community members by incorporating Indigenous Supply Chain Management (ISCM) processes (local contracting/sub-contracting).
- Maintain ongoing communications with Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties throughout planning, construction and reclamation.
- Develop and submit a record of engagement and an engagement plan in accordance with the MVLWB Engagement and Consultation Policy.

As part of our engagement strategy, Westcoast will aim to create opportunities that are aligned with the aspirations of many of the people within Indigenous groups. Our Indigenous relations focus areas include:

- Relationship building
- Creating partnerships to support investment in Indigenous communities
- Capacity building through employment and training programs
- Facilitating economic development

2.2 Project Scope

Westcoast began conducting environmental field studies in summer 2021 to identify potential impacts and develop measures to minimize or eliminate Project impacts. As a result, the scope of work planned within the Northwest Territories will now be conducted during the winter months instead of the summer execution as originally planned.

Westcoast is undertaking work to gather field information and address any potential impacts related to winter construction activities in the area, including remote winter access and ice bridge crossings. Additional Project scope has also been incorporated for locations within the Yukon Territory and Northwest Territories. The abandonment scope now also includes the removal of two pipe segments (KP28.6 and KP46.3).



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Given the extent of the scope changes related to the Project, an amendment to the previous application, which was filed on February 2, 2022, was filed on October 5, 2023. The scope change will also require additional permitting through the MVLWB. Work will commence in Winter 2024 through to Winter 2025, pending regulatory approval.

On November 15, 2022 the CER issued a letter and hearing order Hearing Order MH-004-2022 in relation to the Project. The Project is also subject to a Preliminary Screening determination as set out under the MVRMW.

A Project factsheet and Project update letter has been distributed to provide Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties with details of the proposed Project.

4 ENGAGEMENT WITH IDENTIFIED INDIGENOUS GROUPS AND OTHER POTENTIALLY AFFECTED PARTIES

4.1 Engagement Approach

Using the MVLWB's Engagement Guidelines to align its engagement efforts, Westcoast will conduct communication and outreach activities with identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties prior to and during the construction of the Project. Enbridge's engagement efforts, along with the MVLWB's consultative process, will contribute to meaningful involvement of identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties. Engagement ensures that affected parties and Westcoast are able to:

- Develop an understanding of the proposed Project and components of the Project;
- Provide feedback during the engagement process on issues of concern with regards to the Project, and;
- Work towards building and maintaining long-term relationships in the area.

Engagement with identified Indigenous groups will assist Westcoast in developing an understanding of the social, cultural, and environmental conditions in the area and to potentially adapt and improve the Project in response to these conditions.

This draft Engagement Plan will be continually updated throughout all phases of engagement based on Project developments, as well as input and concerns raised by identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties. Updates may include adjusting the frequency or method of consultation and the addition of Indigenous groups and potentially affected parties as they are identified during the consultation process.



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4.2 Early Engagement

Westcoast has and will continue to initiate dialogue with identified Indigenous groups and potentially affected parties to inform them of the proposed Project, and to seek input into this Plan and future plans.

In the spring and summer of 2020 Westcoast began contacting Indigenous groups to inform them of the proposed Project, as well as to initiate in-person and virtual meetings. Since the summer of 2020 several meetings, phone calls and emails have occurred with Indigenous groups and potentially affected parties. Westcoast has also provided identified Indigenous groups and potentially affected parties with formal Project notifications, these include:

Advised the CER initiated a preliminary screening pursuant to the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board's Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act to determine whether the Project would have a significant adverse impact on the environment or be cause for public concern. Indicated they did not anticipate any significant impacts to traditional land and resource use, but included potential effects and mitigation measures in the environmental and socio-economic assessment. Provided the CER's August 12, 2022 notification letter, and a factsheet and map previously provided in November 2021.
November 22, 2022	Notification that the CER had issued a letter and hearing order on November 15, 2022 regarding the Pointed Mountain Pipeline Abandonment Project. Provided a website link and a copy of the letter and hearing order. Advised the hearing order was issued in response to concerns raised by Liard First Nation on September 13, 2022, noting that the CER considered the letter as a statement of opposition which triggered a hearing process. Stated that Liard First Nation filed a follow up letter on November 21, 2022 clarifying that their previous submission was not intended to be a statement of opposition and they withdrew their initial letter. Advised they were waiting for further direction from the CER regarding the hearing.
September 2023	Notification of Project updates related to the CER Application update was provided to Indigenous groups.
October 6, 2023	Notification of CER Project update filing.
December 6, 2023	Notification of MVWLB filing.

Westcoast will continue to engage with Indigenous groups regarding the Project to foster strong and long-term relationships. Ongoing engagements are occurring with identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties regarding proposed details, timelines, economic benefits, and potential impacts of the Project.

Early engagement feedback and considerations from in-person/virtual meetings, phone calls and emails will be implemented into Project planning throughout 2023 and into 2024.



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4.2.1 Written Notification

Westcoast mailed notification letters and a factsheet regarding the Pointed Mountain Pipeline Abandonment Project. The letter included:

The letter provided contact information for Westcoast and a website link to the CER FAQs regarding pipeline abandonment.

Westcoast mailed notification letters regarding preliminary screening under the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act. The letters included:

- Requirements for preliminary screening and the related public comment period
- Requirements under the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Act

Westcoast mailed Project Update letters providing clarity on scope changes related to the CER Amendment application. The letters included:

- Meeting request
- Contact information for Community and Indigenous Engagement

4.3 Pre-Application Engagement

In this phase of engagement and consultation, ongoing communication with Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties will occur specific to CER's Early Engagement Guide and the MVLWB's Engagement Policy. Activities may include the following:

4.3.1 Project Information Package

Westcoast began sharing Project information documents with Indigenous groups in June 2020 and other potentially affected parties in November 2021, including:

- A Project factsheet
- KMZ files



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- The scope of work
- Westcoast contact information
- Requests for follow-up meetings

4.3.2 Project Updates

Westcoast has shared various Project updates throughout the pre-application period including in-person meetings, presentations, site visits and ongoing communications through email and mailouts.

Westcoast will continue to meet or offer to meet with all potentially affected stakeholders and Indigenous groups based on their interests to address Project-related questions or concerns. These engagements may include in-person community meetings and/or presentations, aerial tours and site visits. Handouts and/or other visuals will continue to be provided in relation to Project updates.

4.3.3 Sustainable Supply Chain Management

Westcoast will liaise with Enbridge's Sustainable Supply Chain Management team to ensure early alignment and to ensure that local economic opportunities are maximized for Indigenous groups.

Westcoast will use local knowledge to understand the capabilities and services provided by local businesses in the Project area to maximize economic benefit to local service providers, community organizations and local people. The bid process will include the requirement for all proponents to submit a Socio-Economic Plan with their submissions to address the employment and contracting opportunities made available to local and Indigenous Peoples, Indigenous contractors, and/or contractors associated with local Indigenous groups.

4.3.4 Site Visits, and Environmental, Traditional Knowledge, and Traditional Land Use Studies

Westcoast asked Indigenous groups how local and Traditional Knowledge could be incorporated into the Project application and planning. Westcoast has requested and relied on Indigenous groups to identify site-specific concerns. Westcoast provided capacity funding to interested Indigenous groups to engage on the Project field program with preconstruction site visit assessments based on community interest. Additional Traditional Land and Resource Use (TLRU) and Traditional Knowledge study work will be evaluated based on community interest.

Westcoast continues to involve members from Acho Dene Koe First Nation and Nahæâ Dehé Dene Band in the Project's field studies and will continue to work with any Indigenous groups that identify site-specific concerns or areas of interest that may require specific mitigation during the abandonment process.



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4.4 Post-Application Engagement

Westcoast's engagement activities will continue after the MVLWB and CER applications have been submitted, with a focus on addressing outstanding issues and informing all potentially affected Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties as construction planning commences. This includes incorporating, where practical, TLRU and Traditional Knowledge information provided by Indigenous groups, as well as providing opportunities for field participation.

Following submission, Westcoast will provide notice of the filing to all identified stakeholders and Indigenous groups, with a link to the applications and contact information. Westcoast will continue to engage with stakeholders and Indigenous groups during the Project by providing Project information and updates through emails, conference call and in-person meetings, responding to questions and concerns, and incorporating feedback into activities where applicable.

Westcoast will hold, at minimum, one community public meeting in the Hamlet of Fort Liard to provide information about the Project using visual communication materials such as display boards, factsheets and/or a presentation. Westcoast team members will be on hand to answer questions and address any concerns.

Westcoast will continue to engage with the various Government of Northwest Territories departments to confirm that the appropriate regulatory requirements are complete as required. If the engagement determines that Westcoast requires additional permissions or notifications, Westcoast will ensure that the requirements are met prior to construction.

Westcoast will provide an orientation regarding planned construction activities, listen to community interests or concerns and address those concerns prior to construction.

4.5 Post-Construction Engagement

In addition to ongoing engagement post-construction, Westcoast will consider undertaking additional engagement activities that may arise as a result of feedback and suggestions from potentially affected parties. An example may be the inclusion of Indigenous participation in post-construction environmental monitoring during reclamation and environmental monitoring activities, based on experience from other projects in the region.

4.6 Communication Tools and Techniques

Westcoast will develop ongoing engagement and communication materials and tactics to support access to information by interested parties and access to the Westcoast team throughout the lifecycle of the Project, which may include but is not limited to:

- Toll free phone line and email address for public inquiries;
- Project information packages that include letters, factsheets, engagement plans and maps; and
- Display boards for community meetings.



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4.7 Engagement Record

An engagement record details any engagement activities related to the Project. Westcoast will use an internal database to track all engagements and communications with Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties. The engagement record will track:

- The dates of any engagement made between Westcoast and potentially affected parties;
- The type of engagement activity (e.g. written notification, phone calls/emails, face-to-face meetings, etc.);
- Issues raised by potentially affected parties;
- Recommendations made by the potentially affected party;
- Enbridge's response to the issues, with an indication of whether the issues are resolved or unresolved.

A summary of engagement with the identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties in the Northwest Territories can be found in Appendix A. Detailed logs can be found in Appendix B.



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Appendix A: Engagement Summary to date

A summary of engagement with the identified Indigenous groups and other potentially affected parties in the Northwest Territories is provided in Table 1 and Table 2 below. Westcoast can confirm it is not aware of any outstanding concerns from the identified parties.

Please note that Driftpile Cree Nation, Foothills First Nation, Louis Bull Tribe, McLeod Lake Indian Band¹, Sucker Creek First Nation, and Whitefish Lake First Nation whose traditional territories are south of the Northwest Territories and the Project area, registered to be intervenors in the CER's process to consider the application for the Project. These groups were not identified as being potentially impacted by the Project due to the location of their traditional territories; however, in their registrations to participate, these groups expressed concerns regarding the Project's potential direct and cumulative adverse effects on their rights. Westcoast offered to meet with the abovementioned groups and their legal counsel recently confirmed their desire to arrange a meeting and requested a Project update. Westcoast provided a Project update and is working to schedule a meeting in January 2024.
