## Identification of waste types and management of waste

The following details the material that may potentially be on site and the methods of disposal. For clarity, there will be no storage of any fuels, lubricants, oils, or any other waste materials on the site as these will be in portable containers on vehicles and will be brought out and removed from the site daily where needed for operational purposes.

Material	Disposal Method	Environmental Impacts of waste
Domestic refuse: food waste and packaging, tissues, cigarette butts.	Contained in vehicles and removed daily and disposed of in contractor domestic garbage containers.	Wildlife attractants
Chemical wastes: used oil containers, used oil filters, used lubricant containers.	Contained in vehicles and removed daily and disposed of according to contractor company policy.	Chemical and environmental hazard
Toxic Material	Contained in vehicles and removed daily and disposed of to contractor company policy.	Toxic and environmental hazard
Human waste (sewage)	No human waste will be deposited on site	N/A
Used absorbent pads for refueling chainsaws.	Placed in vehicle and removed daily and disposed of according to contractor company policy.	Chemical and environmental hazard
Brush and trees less than 12.5 cm	Windrowed and burned at a suitable time on site.	Fire hazard and aesthetics
Trees larger than 12.5 cm	Salvaged and removed from site for fuel wood at suitable time.	Fire hazard and aesthetics
