I received your inspection report – Thank you.

In response to your comments, regarding the onsite soil bags, please see comments below from PSPC and our consultant.

BluMetric was on site the week of August 6th, and has confirmed that the bagged soil that was remaining on site was NOT impacted soil. All bags were identified as non-impacted soil through cross-referencing of the numbers printed on the bags and BluMetrics analysis logs from last season. As well, all impacted bags were clearly marked as such for easy identification by the disposal contractor. It was has then been confirmed that there were 48 bags of non-impacted soil remaining onsite. These bags have since been emptied and spread on site per this season's work plan.

There is a single bag of drill cuttings that remain apart from the non-impacted bags from well installation at Taxiway C late last season that will be removed from site at the earliest convenience.

Inspectors were pleased with the condition of the site. It was kept tidy, and contaminated soil was stored in 48 full lined heli-sacks and 1 partially full heli-sack. Inspectors are curious as to when contaminated soils extracted will be moved to the licenced KBL Environmental Soil Disposal Facility in Yellowknife. The Closure and Reclamation plan submitted in September 2018 stated: "material will be excavated, placed in soil bags, stored on pallets offsite and hauled via winter road for disposal..." (5.4 Investigation of Underlying Soils, page 9). The material is still stored on-site.




